

The White Suite, on its own glorious peninsula, delivered a prime setting for a passionate amateur painter.



As lovely as it is, it was probably not the suite's dramatic sun terrace right over the ocean, but the spacious grounds and private pool that lover of seascapes adored the most. From there, the avid amateur artist would have unobstructed views of billowy white clouds and blue water. One can only imagine his painterly delight.

At The Ocean Spa you will find a wide variety of treatments in a relaxing and serene setting to give your mind, body and soul a chance to relax and re-energize.






